Each summer, Coastguard volunteers perform a very different service in their communities - selling Coastguard Summer Lottery tickets. Each ticket funds their search and rescue operations, covering some of the running costs for each local Coastguard operation.

The Coastguard Summer Lottery has been running for over 16 years and is a big event in many coastal areas of New Zealand. The volunteers are instantly recognisable in their Coastguard uniforms and often flanked by flags, banners and, when it is not needed for an emergency, their Coastguard rescue vessel.

## **Your donations helped Coastguard** Nelson rescue a missing paddler

Clinging to debris and fighting for his life, a missing paddler was rescued due to Coastguard Nelson's incredibly fast response. Thanks to your support, our crews had the skills and training they needed to bring him home to safety.

When a group of people were walking along beautiful Tahunanui Beach in Nelson, they found an abandoned waka ama eerily bobbing about in the shallows. After they phoned the police it was confirmed a local man was missing.

Coastguard Nelson's emergency pagers sounded just before

3pm. The crew leapt into action and within 10 minutes they were on their rescue vessel rushing to the scene.

Conditions at sea were rough with waves towering above them and debris from a recent storm blocking their path. But the skilled crew knew what they were doing, and worked their way towards the most likely area the paddler would have been swept to.

They searched the churning ocean while a police observer joined the search from a nearby hill. It was when the observer spotted a yellow object in the water that Coastguard found the paddler swamped by the large swell and clinging desperately to debris.

The exhausted man had been swept a staggering three kilometres off shore,

and had been pushed under the water several times. He'd been fighting for his life for 90 minutes; he was out of breath and struggling to stay afloat. The crew carefully manoeuvred the rescue boat beside him and hauled him on board to safety.

Coastguard's swift and efficient response meant the entire operation was completed in 36 minutes. The crew were recognised for their fantastic efforts and awarded the Mitre 10 Rescue of the Year at Coastguard's national awards.

There is little doubt the outcome could have been much worse if the crew didn't have the skills and experience to act so quickly. Thanks to your support in providing training and gear for our volunteers, the paddler was rescued and lived to see another day.





Known affectionately by his crew as 'Yoda' for his wisdom and experience, Robb is a Senior Master on his rescue vessel and is heavily involved in the training and development of fellow volunteers.

Robb ensures his training exercises prepare search and rescue volunteers for real life scenarios. He scatters flotsam such as chilly bins, old dinghies and life jackets in the water to present real-life challenges volunteers will face. Robb's ingenuity and ability to think outside the square make him a valuable tutor to his students.

Robb also trains and prepares his volunteer crew for mass rescues, where he tasks them with the difficult job of locating and rescuing multiple people from a simulated boat collision. There have been a number of unfortunate incidents recently involving passenger ferries, so mass rescues are a big focus for Coastguard. Robb's vital training exercises will help save many lives at sea.

## Your donations provide lifesaving first aid gear - thank you

In September we launched our 'rescue ready' appeal, which raised funds for essential first aid gear for our crews. It told the story of Barry Grouby and the rescue crew at Coastguard Rotorua Lakes.

Three kayakers were in peril on Lake Rotorua. A member of the public saw them in trouble, kayaked over and tried to help. But he got into big strife too. That's when our volunteers stepped up and rescued all four of them.

Barry had just sat down for his Saturday breakfast and was looking out onto a cold, windy morning when his pager went off. He dropped everything and rushed to

"It was bloody cold, and there was a fair good chop on the lake," he told us.

As they paddled from Ngongotaha towards Mokoia Island, an icy gale hit the kayakers. The wind whipped the lake into large white-topped waves. It was far too choppy for the kayakers, and one of them suddenly capsized and fell into the freezing water. The shock of the cold water took his breath away and numbed his fingers; his body was so cold. A man on shore saw what had happened and called Coastguard.

Our volunteers put on their rescue gear and launched their rescue vessel into the grey lake.

On board, the crew battled the gruelling conditions. Two-metre swells battered their boat. They had to slow right down; tall waves threatened to capsize them too. The lake was heaving around them, and the wind howled in from the side. When they reached him, Barry recalled, "the kayaker in the water was not in a good way."

With some difficulty, Barry and the crew lifted him horizontally out of the water and into the rescue vessel.
